

ORDINANCE:

AN ORDINANCE MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO KEEP A HOG OR HOGS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF COOPER, TEXAS; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDIANED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF COOPER, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or corporation to keep a hog or hogs within the corporate limits of the City of Cooper, Texas.

SECTION 2. That any person, persons, firm or corporation violating the provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined in any sum not less than One (1.00) Dollar, nor more than Ten (10.00) Dollars; and each and every day any person, persons, firm or corporation on shall keep a hog or hogs within the corporate limits of the City of Cooper, Texas shall be a separate offense.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby specifically repealed.

SECTION 4. That, the fact that the present ordinances of the City of Cooper, Texas, are inadequate and the further and the further fact that an election held on the 5th. day of April, A. D. 1932, a majority of the voters in said election, voted in favor of making it unlawful to keep hogs within the corporate limits of the City of Cooper, Texas, creates an emergency; and a rule requiring reading of ordinances on three several days in hereby suspended and this ordinance is declared an emergency ordinance and shall take effect from and after its passage and approval.
